General Orders #9 "Providing Top Cover"

March 1, 2019

- 1. **Absence of the Commander:** During the period of March 3rd to 7th, several of The Department Officers will be in Washington, D.C. attending the Legislative Conference/Voice of Democracy Awards Presentation. During this period, anyone having any questions and/or needing assistance is to contact the State Office, 605-332-7441.
- 2. **Special Notice:** 2019-2020 There will be a joint theme this year for Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen is: "What Makes America Great?"
- 3. **March is "Membership Quota Month".** All State and District Officers are asked to assist Posts in membership. If your Post hasn't had a membership team working, now is the time to help organize and join in on the recruiting of members.
- 4. **Audit Reports: THIS IS IMPORTANT.** Has your Post sent in its last Audit Report yet? Maybe some of the previous audit reports are delinquent. Catch them up to date, as they are very important.
- 5. **Special Olympics:** Post donations to the Special Olympics Fund are hereby requested to help with the 2019 Special Olympics Program. Posts are asked to be generous and to send their donations to VFW Department headquarters. Our goal this year is \$2,500. Thank You to those Posts that have already sent in their donations.
- 6. **Post Elections:** Attention is called to Section 217, page 71, Manual of Procedure, Nomination Election, Installation, of Officers and Term of Office. Posts will conduct the Election of Officers in accordance with the By-Laws and Manual of Procedure. Post Officers shall be nominated in March and shall be elected in April. Nominations shall remain open until the Post is ready to vote.
- *Remember that on the 1st of June if you have not submitted your election report you will receive a letter from the Commander-in-Chief suspending your Post until the election report is sent. At that time the Department Commander will issue a follow-up letter and establish a committee to oversee the Post business. All Post business must be overseen by the established committee includes any meetings, any disposition of property, any financial transactions, etc. This is an inconvenience for all persons concerned. PLEASE submit you Election Reports timely. (March nominate; April elections; May installation; June take office when Department Commander does.)
- 7. **Installation of Officers:** Attention is called to Section 217, page 71, Manual of Procedure. The Post Commander-elect will select the installing officer who holds or has held a rank at least as high as that of Post Commander. Post officers shall be installed in their respective offices prior to the convening of the Department Convention, but shall not assume their duties until the Department Commander is installed. The installation may be conducted publicly at an open meeting. An officer-elect who may be absent for good and sufficient reason or cause may be installed at any regular or special meeting prior to the

Department convention. If not then installed, the office will automatically become vacant. Officers shall be elected for a term of one (1) year except that three trustees shall initially be elected for terms of one (1), two (2) and three (3) years and thereafter one (1) trustee shall be elected each year for a term of three (3) years.

- 8. **District Commanders:** Attention is called to Section 417, Page 21 of National By-Laws. The elected District officers shall be nominated and elected annually at the District Convention or Spring Meeting. Nomination, election and installation shall be in a manner prescribed in the Manual of Procedure. The District Commander will be installed again at the Department Convention in June 2019 as a member of the Department Council of Administration.
- 9. **Ritual Changes:** Several changes or modifications were made to the 2018 National By-Laws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual that members need to know about. The one addressed here is a change authorized in the Order of Business Posts. Section 1004, page 113 and 114 of the Manual of Procedure lists two orders of business for Posts. One being the Traditional and the one added called Order of Business Contemporary we will address the Contemporary. It is shortened up and is approved for Post usage. However, you can use discretion at the Post and modify to meet your needs. The approved order is:
 - Call to order 2. Check dues cards 3. Roll call of officers 4. Read, refer membership applications 5. Read minutes 6. Quartermaster's report. 7. Report of Service Officer. 8. Report on Comrades or the families of Comrades in distress. 9. Committee reports. 10. Unfinished Business. 11. New business. 12. Good of the order. 13. Close meeting. The options that you have are to satisfy your needs for a successful meeting.
- 10. **Community Service Record Books:** Attention Post Commanders and Community Service Chairpersons. Less than 60 days remain in this year's contest for Community Service Record Books. All Community Service projects completed during the period April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019, should be included when making your Post/Auxiliary Record Book. Record Books must be received by April 18, 2019 and are to be sent to State Chairman, Barb McKean, 504 S Wallace St., Parkston, SD 57366. A Community Record Book form may be downloaded from the Department Web site **sdvfw.org.**
- 11. **Buddy Poppies:** All Posts are reminded to order their Buddy Poppies and poppy supplies and to complete arrangements for their year's poppy distribution. Order forms may be downloaded from the Department Web site **sdvfw.org.**
- 12. **Department Convention:** The 2019 Department Convention will be held on June 14th-16th, 2019 in Madison, hosted by Post 2638. For more convention information, i.e.: registration, motel information, convention schedule, etc., go to the Home Page at the Department web site **sdvfw.org.**
- 13. **Convention Ads:** All Posts, Districts, Candidates for Department Office and any others are reminded that the deadline for Ads in the 2019 Convention Booklet is due by May 6th, 2019. Ads need to be in camera ready or submitted in digital format. Convention book ad submission form may be downloaded from the Department web site **sdvfw.org.**

- 14. **National Citations:** To qualify for the National Citations that are presented at the Department Convention, Posts must have reported projects in each of the following programs: Youth, Safety, Community Service and Citizenship Education (Americanism) and reports need to be into the State Chairman Barb McKean, 504 S Wallace St., Parkston, SD 57366, by March 20, 2019. The deadline date to get the information to National is April 1, 2019.
- 15. **Memorial Day:** The observance of Memorial Day is the obligation of every Post. According to Section 223-Commemorative Dates. Each Post shall properly observe commemorative dates, as prescribed in the Ritual and Manual of Procedure. Please plan a suitable observance in your Community. Place American Flags at the gravesites of departed comrades of your Post and Veterans of your Community. Remember to report details **of** these events in your Community Service Report. Memorial Day report form may be downloaded from the Department web site **sdvfw.org.**
- 16. **Peace Officer Memorial Day:** The United States Flag shall be flown at half-mast until noon on May 15, 2019. All Posts are requested to comply with this order.
- 17. **Spring District Meetings**: See separate sheet on meeting places, dates and times.

Staying within the guidelines of the Department Membership Program 2018-2019 established by Commander Frisby-Griffin encouraging Life Members and LEGACY Life Members we are putting together an incentive program that will run through May 31, 2019. Remember, this is in addition to the Commanders Program. Commencing 1 March 2019 any member that is recruited as a REINSTATE or NEW MEMBER the first 25 members with have their name put in a drawing for a Life Membership to be held as soon as the number reaches 25. In addition, if the recruiter does not qualify for any cash award offered in the Commanders Program, they will receive a monetary \$25 award. The incentive will continue until the next 50 members are recruited which at this point will be 74 names and then another Life Membership will be given. The recruiter of that person will receive \$50 if they do not qualify for other membership incentive awards. We will continue in groups of 50 until 31 May 2019 is reached. Registration for Convention will be \$80 per member prior to May 20, 2019, and \$100 after May 20, 2019.

Individual banquet tickets will be sold to non-members for \$40. This will also include a name badge for the Hospitality Night. You can purchase these tickets in advance by informing us on your registration form. Cut-off time for additional banquet tickets will be 4 PM Friday June 14, 2019.

Those who have registered by May 20, 2019, will have their name entered into an "Early Bird Drawing." Two drawings will be made at the Convention for \$50 each. So, get your registration in by May 20, 2019 to possibly be a winner.
