September 17, 2016 – Celebrate America's Freedom Event at Mt. Rushmore.

September 17, 2016 – Constitution and Citizenship Day commemorating the formation and signing of the U. S. Constitution on September 17, 1787.

September 23 – 25, 2016 – Fall Council/Commander and President Homecoming, Pierre, SD – Registration in GO #1; September 24, 2016 – School of Instruction – All Auxiliaries should have at least one representative and President in attendance.

September 25, 2016 – Gold Star Mother's/Family's Day honoring mothers and families who have a lost a service member in combat.

October – District Meetings – Dates and Line Officer Assignments – GO #2

October 8, 2016 – A DAY TO CHANGE DIRECTION – see details in August 18, 2016, VFW Auxiliary E-Newsletter October 21 – 23, 2016 – BIG TEN, Kalamazoo, MI – Registration in GO #1

November 11, 2016 – Veterans Day is an opportunity to publicly commemorate the contributions of living veterans. November 12, 2016 – Deadline to mail Christmas tree ornaments to Deb Fahey.

School of Instruction: Everyone is encouraged and welcome to attend the School of Instruction on September 24, 2016, in Pierre, SD. Presidents, Treasurers and Secretaries are especially encouraged to attend. This is a tremendous learning experience and/or review. Please do not miss this opportunity. Things are constantly changing, and the more we keep up with the changes and keep ourselves informed and educated the better we can serve our veterans and families. For example, did you note in the September issue of the Auxiliary magazine that there are three types of meetings an Auxiliary can choose from, i.e. Roundtable, Contemporary and Traditional. See the Ritual for each type and how to do them. <u>An Auxiliary can choose by majority vote which format to use</u>. If you have not done this, please do so at the meeting in which you are reading these GO's. Each Auxiliary should have the latest 2016 Podium Edition of the Bylaws and Rituals, which is the edition which Auxiliaries need to follow.

Membership: As of August 26, 2016, SD's membership was 76.70%. That is great, but we need more. Our first membership goal is to have 50 NEW and REJOIN members by October 31, 2016, for a cash award of \$200. We are about three-fifths (3/5) of the way there. We can do this if we all work together. Think about making another dues notice. The most effective contact is person-to-person or telephone. Auxiliaries should have at least three (3) dues notices per year.

District President Inspections: All Auxiliaries should have received the form "So the District President Is Coming For An Inspection," from their District Presidents, which was in the book for all Auxiliaries given to the District Presidents for distribution at the State Convention. I am also including another copy with this GO's. Please prepare for the Inspection and do not hesitate to visit with the District President letting her know just how much your Auxiliary does and also your concerns. The more communication we have, the better we can help each other. If an Auxiliary is struggling, the District

and Department need to know now rather than later. **District Presidents** please remember to send a copy of each Inspection report to me as Department President.

BONDS: As of writing these GO's, all but one Auxiliary bond has been received at National, and I'm hopeful that will show up on Monday, you know how the snail mail moves. I want to thank everyone for your assistance with getting this done in a timely manner. It is greatly appreciated.

Monday, September 5, I will be accompanying Commander Dennis to Wagner for the Labor Day parade. Everyone says it is a tremendous parade.



On August 8, Brian Duffy and Colette Bishop told us all about the Mental Wellness Campaign and "A Day to Change Direction," the day of action with Give an Hour and the Campaign to Change Direction. Here are more details so you can join on with this effort and execute a quality event.

First, the ask for October 8 is two-fold:

- Conduct a community service project of your choosing. If October 8 does not work for you, or if you already have something similar planned, that is fine. The goal is to have as many community events on or around October 8 as possible.
- Discuss mental wellness in the context of "Know the Five Signs" of emotional stress. This can be done by a Post Surgeon, a local mental health care provider, a Give an Hour volunteer, or a VA care provider. If you want to know how to find someone to assist, please let us know. We will provide the necessary info in the coming weeks to Post/Department leadership who sign up to participate on October 8.

Second, please have your Posts and Auxiliaries contact us via email to confirm plans to participate in the October 8 event or a previously scheduled Mental Health Awareness

event: <u>LRolf@vfw.org</u>. We want to have a solid list of participants by September 9, 2016 to report to our Give an Hour partners for coordination of local resources. This list should include the following information:

SO THE DISTRICT PRESIDENT IS COMING FOR AN INSPECTION

Expectations for a VFW Auxiliary inspection depend upon your perspective. The perspectives differ between the District President traveling to an unfamiliar Post Home and the VFW Auxiliary President anxiously awaiting her representative on the Department Council of Administration to check out what goes on at a meeting.

The comparison that follows shows the basics of an inspection and how the inspection can be a learning experience for both the District and VFW Auxiliary Presidents.

	VFW Auxiliary President Duties	District President Duties	
Before the Inspection	Coordinate with District President to schedule a date and time for inspection. Confirm with him/her any meals and if he/she is bringing any guests.	Initiate scheduling process with the Ladies Auxiliary to attend a regular business meeting. Inform the VFW Auxiliary of any guests or special needs.	
Meeting Room	If Conductress is not present, arrange the U.S. Flag, banner, and Patriotic Flag, altar cloth, Bible and chairs for a meeting.	Sits to the right of the VFW Auxiliary President	
Agenda & Gavel	Having an agenda/order of business is a sign of a well-organized President, and it should be made according to the current Bylaws. Have the gavel present as an emblem of authority, but use it according to the Bylaws and with discretion.	Follow along with the agenda to ensure that the meeting is conducted according to the Ritual. Makes notes on programs covered, etc. Has comments/talking points when called upon for his/her comments.	
Books of Secretary & Treasurer	It is the President's duty to see that the Secretary's and Treasurer's Books are available for inspection. Copy of President's and Treasurer's bonds and copies of audits are to be incorporated into the Secretary's minute book, 3-ring binder or clip folder.	Sign and date each set of books after reviewing for these things: signatures of Trustees for audited books, incorporation of Treasurer's report(s) and audit(s) into minutes by the Secretary. Proof of a bond for the President and Treasurer in the Secretary's minutes record book. Sign all pages if in a clip folder or 3-ring notebook.	
Chairmen's Reports	If a Chairman is absent, have a report given on that program and describe the VFW Auxiliary participation.		
After the Meeting	Make sure the District President has what he/she needs in order to complete his/her inspection report.	Complete inspection report and give a copy to both the VFWAuxiliary and Department Presidents.

<u>Our troops and their families need support now more than ever remember</u>, to keep your Adopt-A-Unit active, must receive an annual Adopt-A-Unit activity report. Units in need of your help <u>I have</u> <u>names of unit's</u> that need your help or to adopt a unit.

<u>Veterans & Family Support</u> is at the center of our programs. Our programs are a continuous circle with our veterans and their families being at its heart and soul.

<u>How can you involve families through this program?</u> Our Veterans & Family Support Program should begin at home and involve the entire family. Here are just a few examples of how you can involve families in our Veterans & Family Support projects:

Soldiers still need care packages, cards and coupons. As a family you can work to collect and/or donate some of these items, as well as write cards and letters to be sent to our troops overseas.
Collect Campbell's Labels for Education for the VFW National Home for Children.

<u>Plan on each volunteer distributing 200 Poppies.</u> It sounds like a lot, but with the right placement in the community, 200 will go fast. Multiply the number of volunteers by 200 and that's approximately how many you should order. Choose distribution dates. Memorial Day and Veterans Day are always a popular time, but any time is a good time to distribute this memorial flower. Request from your Department Headquarters an order form to purchase your Poppies at least 8 to 12 weeks in advance of your distribution dates. Stake out key distribution venues in advance. <u>Remind your volunteers that they are not "selling" Buddy Poppies, but distributing them with the hope of getting donations.</u> Set up a booth at county fairs, public forums, school events, church suppers or other civic organization meetings. Let your imagination and that of your volunteers guide you in distributing these beautiful red flowers.

<u>PROJECT EXAMPLES</u>: Marching in patriotic holiday parades, Organizing assembly, collection and delivery of care packages for troops, Volunteering to help veterans and active-duty military and their families.

"What have you done for a veteran or his/her family today?"

<u>Another unit is being deployed in South Dakota</u> 153rd More than 160 Soldiers from the South Dakota Army National Guard units based out of <u>Huron and Parkston</u> have received an official mobilization order to Kuwait beginning in November 11, 2016. 

VFW annually recognizes the nation's top classroom elementary, junior high and high school teachers who teach citizenship education topics regularly and promote America's history and traditions effectively.

Teachers who promote civic responsibility, flag etiquette and patriotism are prime candidates for this award. For example, do you know a teacher who plans field trips to city hall or organizes community volunteer projects? Maybe you know an instructor who invites veterans into the classroom to discuss their military experiences. Perhaps you are familiar with a teacher who fosters the development of democratic values and beliefs through special projects. If you know of such a teacher, honor him or her today with the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award.

VFW Cares About Education

Founded in 1899, the VFW highly supports the education of America's youth. VFW and its Auxiliary have developed a slate of programs dedicated to helping America's educators. VFW Citizenship Education programs stimulate interest in America's history, traditions, Americanism, civic responsibility, flag etiquette and patriotism.

VFW wants to identify and recognize America's best educators who instill a sense of national pride in students. It offers cash awards, commemorative plaques and all-expenses-paid trips to the VFW National Convention for these worthy teachers. The trip provides an opportunity for winners to network with like-minded individuals.

Teachers care deeply about America and its children. They're concerned about the perpetuation of America's noblest traditions and highest ideals. Wouldn't you like to see them get the honor they deserve? Now you can...

How Does the Contest Work?

Based on the nominees submitted, VFW local chapters, called Posts, will recognize one outstanding teacher in grades K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Posts then submit these winners' names to their District-level judging, who will forward their winners to the Department (or state) level. After judging, each Department then forwards the names of its winners to VFW National Headquarters for consideration in the national awards contest.

Who is eligible?

All current classroom teachers (teaching at least half of the school day in a classroom environment) in grades K-12 are eligible. Previous national VFW winners and homeschool teachers are ineligible. Nominations can be submitted by fellow teachers, supervisors or other interested individuals (not relatives). Self-nominees are not eligible.

How are teachers norminated? Fill out the nomination form contained in this brochure. In 350 words or less, describe why you feel your nominee should be selected. Describe the teacher's innovative teaching and resource development methods, as well as his or her dedication to education. Please submit your completed nomination form and signed essay to your local VFW Post. Visit wwwrfw.org for Post locations or call VFW Programs Department at (816) 756-3390 ext. 287 to find the Post nearest to you.

All Post-level nominees, if they win, should provide a one-page resume, up to five pages of documentation of their teaching experience (references, news articles, etc.) and a head-and-shoulder photo of themselves. These items will be forwarded on to the District with the nomination form and essay. When is the deadline? Nominations must be submitted to your local Post by February 15. Judging occurs February 16-28.

What are the National awards?

Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Awards include the items below:

- A national \$1,000 Past Commander-in-Chief John Smart award for each of the top K-5, 6-8 and 9-12 teachers for professional development expenses.
- \$1,000 award for each winning teacher's school.
- Plaques for both the winning teacher and school.
 - An all-expenses-paid trip to attend the VFW National Convention.

NOTE: (Winners will receive a 1099-MISC as a result of their award and all-expense paid trip.)

Contact your Legislators (a list was in my first GO's), we know they are backing Hot Springs but give them your opinion and let them know you are behind them, numbers make a difference.

VA Health Care Suicides and Homelessness VA Compensation and Benefits Seamless Transition Education and Employment Defense and Homeland Security Military Quality of Life POW/MIA

ASK THEM TO PARTICIPATE

The key to keeping new members is getting them involved. Call or e-mail a new member within a week with the next meeting date and time, or the next possible event or project. Offer to pick him/her up, or invite him/her to get coffee before or after.

Put a team of members in charge of contacting new members or members who haven't been to a meeting recently. These members should be friendly and knowledgeable.

* Emails and phone calls for special events

*Public recognition of current volunteers (Consider posters at your VFW Post Home, if permitted, that spotlight member involvement)

* Be specific about what they will be doing, including the time commitment

* Find out how that person best communicates, whether by phone, email, Facebook or texting

* If they say "no" to the first invitation, be sure to ask again!

THE IMPORTANCE OF FAMILY EVENTS

An adult who still has children in the home will want opportunities to do things with his or her family. If he or she can't bring his or her children and spouse to at least some of the events, he or she will be most likely to join or to continue his or her membership. Be sure that you plan at least one family-friendly event every three months, or once per quarter.

When working with youth, it is important to consider their safety and needs. We would like to offer these tips and resources so that you can make sure that all youth you encounter have the best experience possible.

- Consider taking Youth Protection training. Many organizations working with youth provide and require training. One of the best known is done by Boy Scouts. You do not need to be a member or even involved with the program in order to take their free online training. Find it here: http://www.scouting.org/Training/youthprotection.aspx
- ✤ 2. Always respect the time commitments of youth. They are very busy. Be clear about when an event or project starts and how long it will go for. Parents also very much appreciate it when their child is finished at the stated time.
- ✤ 3. Parents should always be welcome to stay and take part in the activity.

- ✤ 4. No matter the project or event, make sure that proper safety measures are taken for everyone involved. Also, be sure that activities or projects are age appropriate.
- ✤ 5. Be extremely conscious of the location where you bring or meet the youths.
- ✤ 6. Do not smoke, drink or use drugs around them.
- ✤ 7. If you are taking youth somewhere other than the Post home or a school, consider getting permission slips from every parent, and make sure the parents understand that the children may be riding in personal vehicles.
- 8. Receive training from your local Child Abuse Prevention Council or Child Protective Center on the Mandated Suspected Child Abuse Reporting Laws in your State for those working with children.
- 9. Find out if you need to have individuals working with youth/children fingerprinted before working with youth. There may be laws in your state.
- 10. Maintain and model healthy boundaries with children be a role model. Remember it is never appropriate to displays acts of violence or abuse around or towards children.

Remember that it only takes a minute to make a difference in the life of a child. There are lots of small, positive things we can all do to help protect and nurture our children that only take a minute. A few words of praise and encouragement to a child, listening carefully to what a child has to say, showing a child you care, all are simple actions that added together have been shown to have a profound impact on a child's life. In these very real ways, we can all support children and strengthen families.

5. Are the offices of your Auxiliary President and Treasurer bonded by August 31st?

These questions are just a part of the *RU Healthy Auxiliary Checklist*. Over the year we will be offering other tools we can use to become an active and healthy Auxiliary in our community.

There is the anonymous survey of *Healthy Auxiliary Member Questionnaire* that can help us determine our Auxiliary's challenges.

Also available is the Auxiliary Meeting Clinic. This can help us solve issues at our meetings.

Healthy Communication with your Auxiliary members will also be addressed. We will discuss the use of tradition and non-traditional forms of communication to our members for meetings, events and programs.

Offering a *Good Job Certificate* to say "thank you" will be presented. Having the Auxiliary show their appreciation to a member (or non-member) for their help, participation or support in events and programs is a key ingredient to the health of our Auxiliary.
