# Circle of Excellence

elcome to the Circle of Excellence. There is no longer an Outstanding Department President Award. Instead, every Department President will have the opportunity to join the Circle of Excellence. The criteria are below. National Headquarters will be tracking this information. Consider this a checklist for the year of important items and deadlines that must be met. Membership is an important factor and will be encouraged by the Conference Membership Coaches, who will be working with Department Membership Chairmen to achieve the membership portion of the Circle of Excellence criteria.

#### Criteria for entering the Circle of Excellence:

#### 1. Growth in Membership:

\_\_\_\_ 100% Plus by June 30, 2019, based on June 30, 2018 final membership statistics.

#### 2. Comply with Bylaws/Administrative Follow-Through:

- \_\_\_\_\_ All Installation Reports received at National Headquarters by July 31 or request a suspension by that date for time to mentor and rebuild the Auxiliary.
- \_\_\_\_\_ All Auxiliaries must be bonded by August 31. If not, the Department must send a request for a suspension by that date for time to mentor and rebuild the Auxiliary.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Must have submitted a Council-approved Audit and Budget by October 1 or request for an extension before that date.
  - \_\_\_\_ Department, District and Auxiliary Officers (Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers) dues paid by December 31or a letter/email to relieve any non-paid officers to National Headquarters by January 10.

#### 3. Department Communication:

- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department MUST have an active Facebook page, with at least one post per month beginning in July and ending in June.
- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department MUST communicate with every Auxiliary at least quarterly in one or more of the following ways: email, mail, phone, website, Facebook, General Orders, newsletter or e-newsletters.
- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department Chairmen in each program MUST send at least four promotional and/or communications to their National Ambassadors.

#### 4. Training & Mentoring:

- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department President MUST attend at least one of the "Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation" training workshops held by the National Organization throughout the year.
- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department MUST incorporate the training of "Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation" in every District (if applicable) and at least one Department event.
- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department MUST incorporate at least one training session on using MALTA for all members in attendance.
- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department MUST utilize the Online Auxiliary Academy videos at least one time at a Departmentorganized training/school of instruction/meeting/convention/event.
- \_\_\_\_\_ The Department MUST appoint a mentoring team(s) to assist with failing and/or weak Auxiliaries and Districts. Describe actions taken.

#### 5. Programs Participation:

\_\_\_\_\_ Department President MUST submit online Year-End Report.

- \_\_\_\_\_ What did your Department do to engage every Auxiliary in the work of the organization?
- \_\_\_\_\_ The National Historian must receive an Official Visit report within 15 days of the National President's visit.

The time is now to start thinking about nominating that special teacher for the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Award. We all have wonderful teachers in our school systems and what better way to honor them than to nominate them for this award. I am enclosing a brochure in the General Orders or you can go online and print the form. Put on your thinking hats and nominate that special teacher.

I will be attending my first National VFW Convention in Kansas City and am so excited for the opportunity to attend. I will be taking in as many of the events as possible and hope to come back with many new and exciting ideas to share with everyone.

Listed are several Patriotic Days to promote Patriotism in your communities. Contact your local newspaper and radio stations and ask them to promote these days and educate our communities.

Patriot Day, also known as the National Day of Service and Remembrance, occurs on September 11 each year in memory of those killed during the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. Those we lost September 11, 2001, will forever hold a cherished place in our hearts and in the history of our nation. By a joint resolution approved December 18, 2001, (Public Law 107-89), Congress authorized the President to designate September 11 of each year as "Patriot Day" to perpetuate the memory of those who perished in the attack on America, and to pursue peace and justice in the world and security at home. Appropriate ceremonies and activities include a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 a.m. EDT, remembrance services and candlelight vigils. Flags should be flown at half-staff on Patriot Day.

This day commemorates the formation and signing of the U.S. Constitution on September 17, 1787 by 39 delegates to the Constitutional Convention. This document established the framework of our government and the rights and freedoms that "We the People" enjoy today. In 1940, Congress designated the third Sunday in May as "I am an American Day." In 1944, "I am an American Day" was promoted by the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service. On February 29, 1952, Congress moved "I am an American Day" observation to September 17 and renamed it "Citizenship Day." In 2004, Congress renamed the holiday "Constitution Day and Citizenship Day" and mandated that all publicly-funded educational institutions and all federal agencies provide educational programming on the history of the American Constitution on this day

## **POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY** THIRD FRIDAY IN SEPTEMBER

POW/MIA Recognition Day honors the commitments and the sacrifices made by our nation's prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action.

National POW/MIA Recognition Day is one of the six days specified by law on which the black POW/MIA flag shall be flown over federal facilities and cemeteries, post offices and military installations. By custom, it is on the third Friday in September.

Gold Star Mother's/Family's Day honors mothers and families who have lost a service member in the line of duty or in support of military activities.

The name comes from the custom of families hanging Service Flags in the window of their homes. The Service Flag has a star for each family member in the armed forces. A blue star represents a family member in active-duty service, a silver star represents a family member wounded or injured in a war zone and a gold star represents a family member killed during active-duty and stands for sacrifice made for honor and freedom.

The American Gold Star Mothers, Inc. was founded shortly after World War I by Grace Darling Seibold, who lost her son, George Vaughn Seibold, during the war. Gold Star Mothers are often socially active, but are non-political. Gold Star Mother's Day was designated by Congress on June 23, 1936.

In September 2012, President Barack Obama rededicated the last Sunday in September as "Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day." Veterans

All Post-level nominees, if they win, should provide a one-page resume, up to five pages of documentation of their teaching experience (references, news articles, etc.) and a head-and-shoulder photo of themselves. These items will be forwarded on to the District with the Post Teacher Entry form, nomination form and essay.

#### When is the deadline?

Nominations must be submitted to your local Post by October 31. Judging occurs November 1-15.

#### What are the National awards?

What does the Chief of Staff do? She/he is the main point of contact for the Extension program. This program includes establishing new Auxiliaries and maintaining our current Auxiliaries in the Department. She/he serves as Auxiliary advocate and assistant.

In this bulletin, let us address maintaining our current Auxiliaries. **Do you think your Auxiliary is healthy?** To answer that question, listed below only five things that are required of an Auxiliary from the National organization:

**1.** An Auxiliary should hold at least 10 business meetings a year. Remember: To have a quorum for a meeting you must have at least 5 Auxiliary members in good standing present.

2. Dues should be paid on at least 10 members on or before February 1 of the current year.

3. Auxiliary Trustees must submit to the Department Treasurer quarterly audit reports.

4. Auxiliary officers must be elected and installed and reported to National Headquarters

no later than June 30<sup>th</sup>. This generates the bond application via email.

5. The Auxiliary President and Treasurer MUST be bonded by August 31st.

These 5 essentials of an Auxiliary are just a part of the *RU Healthy Auxiliary Checklist*. This is a simple list of business items that an Auxiliary should achieve every year.

There is the anonymous survey of *Healthy Auxiliary Member Questionnaire*. This can help an Auxiliary bring to light issues that members may not talk about in a group setting.

Also available is the Auxiliary Meeting Clinic. This can help us solve issues at our meetings.

*Healthy Communication* with your Auxiliary members will also be addressed. We will discuss the use of tradition and non-traditional forms of communication to our members for meetings, events and programs.

Offering a *Good Job Certificate* to say "thank you" can be presented. Having the Auxiliary show their appreciation to a member (or non-member) for their help, participation or support in events and programs is a key ingredient to the health of our Auxiliary.

I am certain that when we take advantage of these wonderful resources our Auxiliary will become stronger. Attitude Is a Little Thing That Makes a Big Difference and keeping a positive and supportive attitude about our Auxiliary will help us to Believe—We Can Do It! Thank you for your great dedication to our Veterans and their families.

#### Budget

To fully fund VA and DOD programs and services, Congress must:

- End budget sequestration and adjust outdated budget caps.
- Authorize VA to receive reimbursements from TRICARE and Medicare.
- Never reduce one veteran's benefits to pay for another.
- Ensure the POW/MIA Accounting mission is fully funded.

#### Work Force Development and Accountability

To attract and maintain a quality workforce, Congress and VA must:

- Improve hiring authorities to recruit and retain a high quality workforce.
- Provide quality training programs for employees and managers.
- Quickly investigate, discipline and remove employees who underperform or endanger veterans' lives.

#### **Health Care**

To ensure that veterans receive timely access to high quality, comprehensive, and veteran-centric care at no added cost to veterans, Congress, VA and DOD must:

- Consolidate VA's community care programs into a single, integrated system.
- Modernize VA's health IT systems.
- Expand current caregiver benefits to veterans of all eras.
- Strengthen VA and DOD health care and research for mental health and traumatic brain injuries (TBI).
- Further expand gender-specific programs and competencies.
- Provide care and benefits to veterans and family members impacted by toxic exposures.

- Prevent the increase of pharmaceutical copayments.
- Conduct medical research on the benefits of medical cannabis.
- Extend telehealth services.
- Make nursing home eligibility part of the VA health care benefits package.

#### **Compensation and Benefits**

To ensure veterans and their dependents have timely access to earned benefits, Congress and VA must:

- Require treatment of presumptive conditions as a claim for disability compensation.
- Establish presumptive service connection for hearing loss, tinnitus, TBI, and exposure to certain toxic substances.
- Increase burial allowances to account for inflation and include spouses' information on all headstones.
- Reform the Gulf War Illness Disability Benefits Questionnaire.
- Address veterans' homelessness by increasing the availability of affordable housing.
- Adjust Grant and Per Diem Program rates for inflation.
- Prohibit VA compensation and non-service-connected pension from being considered countable income for homeless programs.

#### **Education, Employment and Transition Assistance**

To ensure veterans have an opportunity to obtain meaningful employment after leaving military service, they must have access to:

- High quality and sustainable education benefits.
- Strong employment and training programs.
- Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment services throughout their lifetime.
- Small business development opportunities.
- Civilian credentials or academic credit for the professional training they receive during military service.

- Government hiring and contracting opportunities.
- A national veterans treatment court advocate within VA.
- Education and training in new and expanding career fields.
- Proper knowledge and training in transition programs.

#### **Defense/Homeland Security**

To fully support U.S. troops and their mission to fight the war on terrorism and protect our nation's citizens and interests around the world, Congress, DOD and the Department of Homeland Security must:

- Halt the development and/or proliferation of weapons of mass destruction.
- Fully fund and deploy a U.S. missile defense system.
- Secure America's borders.

#### **Military Quality of Life**

To maintain a quality and comprehensive benefits and retirement package that is the backbone for an allvolunteer force, Congress and DOD must:

- Preserve the integrity of TRICARE.
- Protect and improve on-base quality of life programs.
- Pass full concurrent receipt of military retirement pay and VA disability compensation.
- Eliminate the Survivor Benefit Plan/Dependency and Indemnity Compensation offset for surviving military retiree spouses.

#### **POW/MIA**

To make POW/MIA recovery a national priority, Congress and DOD must:

 Expand partnerships with host nations and private/ public organizations to achieve the fullest possible accounting of U.S. military personnel missing from all wars.

One *Patriotic Vest Pin* to each VFW and VFW Auxiliary member who recruits 10 new and/or rejoined members to the VFW Auxiliary from July 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019. 3. *National Membership Achievement Award:* Each VFW or VFW Auxiliary member who recruits 20 new and/or rejoined members from July 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019 with the official form received at National Headquarters by May 31, 2019.

There are three categories: #1. Public Promotion of Poppy Campaign: must have a message soliciting a donation for and wearing of the VFW Buddy Poppy: #2. Memorial or Inspirational: must be designed to honor the dead or to inspire devotion to God or Country, or to magnify the activities supported by the Buddy Poppy. #3: Artistic or Decorative use of Poppies: such as wreaths, pictures, plaques, hats, or corsages. At least ONE POPPY used in the display must be in its original form and color; with the label attached. Post name, Post number, city or state (including the shape of state) may NOT be visible on display entries; failure to comply will result in disqualification. So now, lets' get busy thinking of a great idea for a display and make it tough for the judges next year at convention.

Interesting articles about their activities and events may be found in the paper called Home Notes. You may also follow National Home on Facebook if you'd like. #### Creating, Sponsoring and Working with Youth Groups

Under the Auxiliary Youth activities Program, an Auxiliary can sponsor a youth group and engage youth in any one of our programs, including activities to honor our Veterans or assist our active-duty military and their families. Take advantage of the service aspects some youth groups require because various types of community service or activities are needed to earn merits in their units and they may be looking for just such an opportunity as you can provide. Don't forget the older students either, college-bound seniors earn merits in their units. College-bound seniors earn school credit for some of these same activities.

Here are some ideas of ways to get not only the youth, but the entire community involved in projects; • Host community volunteer days to: • Cleanup your local Post, community park or playground • Assist with home repairs for shut-in veterans or deployed service members • Visit hospitals or nursing homes to play games or read to patients; help them write letters or cards to loved ones and record the veteran's story for historical value. • Invite a local choir to perform at special events • Have students make and write notes to Veterans' Hospitals

Remember that there are citations available from National Headquarters to present to youth groups in recognition of their efforts and service projects that honor our veterans or assistance to active-duty military and their families and that involving youth in service to Veterans in conjunction with our Auxiliary can bring new membership to your Auxiliary. When youth and the whole family are included, members feel more invested in your Auxiliary.

Getting our young people involved in community events and projects will go a long way in helping to build respect for the environment and the country.
