South Dakota Elects 90th State Commander

Sean Johnson became the Commander of South Dakota Veterans of Foreign Wars in 15 June 2019 during the 89th annual VFW Convention in Madison, South Dakota.

SSG Johnson served nearly 26 years in the United States Army Reserve from 22 June 1988 to 10 February 2014. He earned his first VFW eligibility in 1990 during Desert Shield/ Desert Storm with the 311th EVAC HOSP. In 1007, he served in (Bosnia) Tazar, Hungary with

the 452nd OD CO. During the Global War on Terrorism, he deployed to Balad, Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from 2005-2006 also with the 452nd OD CO.

In recognition of his service, he received the Meritorious Unit Citation, Purple Heart, Meritorious Service Medal, Combat Action Badge, Army Service Ribbon 2nd Award, Armed Forces Reserve Medal M Device 3rd Award Silver Hourglass 20 years, Armed Forces Service Medal, Army Good Conduct Award, Army Achievement Medal 2nd Award, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal 5th Award, Army Overseas Service Ribbon 2nd Award, National Defense Service Medal with Bronze Star, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal 3 Bronze Stars, Iraq Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Soldiers Medal, NATO Service Medal, Kuwait Liberation Medal Kuwait, Kuwait Liberation Medal Saudi Arabia.

SSG Johnson joined the VFW in 1990 at post 1307 in Elgin, IL. In 1995, he transferred his membership to C.C. Croal Post 17 in Aberdeen, SD, where he maintains his Silver Legacy. He became active in his local post in 2009 as Surgeon and worked his way up the chairs as Junior Vice, Senior Vice, and Commander before stepping down in 2018 to focus on his state office. SSG Johnson began serving the Department of South Dakota in 2016 as Surgeon and has continued this service as Junior Vice, Senior Vice and Commander.

VFW at a Glance

Origins: In 1899, the American Veterans of Foreign Service (Columbus, Ohio) and the National Society of the Army of the Philippines (Denver, Colo.) were organized to secure rights and benefits for veterans of the Spanish-American War

Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. VFW was chartered by Congress in 1936.

Membership Eligibility: Those serving honorably in the U.S. Armed Forces in a foreign war or overseas operation recognized by a campaign medal, in Korea after June 30, 1949, and recipients of hostile-fire or imminent danger pay. Veterans of World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, Persian Gulf, Somalia, Kosovo, Afghanistan, Iraq and other smaller expeditionary campaigns, as well as occupation duty, qualify.

I recommend that Post Officers go to the Department website at: vfwsd. org and then click on the "forms" quick link and download or print off

a copy of the post inspection form. This way you can look it over and have things ready for when you are inspected. Some of the things to have ready for the inspector are when by-laws were signed by the National Commander, when the Post was incorporated with the Secretary of State, what the full name of the incorporated unit is, and name of the Registered Agent with the State. Having this makes it easier for the Inspector to fill out the inspection sheet accurately and quickly. Just answering 'yes' for all of these is technically not acceptable. A 'no' answer on the inspection is not a bad thing, it can be explained and is not a black mark for the Post.

I am also in charge of the newsletter judging for the Department. We follow the National judging rules; the main one being that they judge newsletters by calendar years, not the VFW year. On a statewide level there was very good participation during the 2018 calendar year. So far this year, I am not seeing as much participation. SSG Johnson was employed by the Aberdeen Fire Department as a Fire Lieutenant/Paramedic for 13 years from 1995-2008 before he medically retired.

Since his retirement, he has been an active member of the Disabled American Veterans, Blinded Veterans Association, Military Order of the Purple Heart, American Legion, 40 et 8, and Cooties.

SSG Johnson learned to ride a tandem cycle after completing blind rehab. After participating in several training camps, he went on to compete in cycling and track and field in the Warrior Games in 2014, 2015, and 2016 where he won several bronze, silver and gold medals. In 2017, he competed at the Invictus Games in Toronto where he earned a gold medal in the 1500 meter run.

SSG Johnson and his wife of 25 years, have three grown children and three grandchildren. They live in Aberdeen, South Dakota.

SDDVA Secretary Whitlock's June Column – New Laws Impacting Veterans



Each year South Dakota agencies, legislators, constituents, and lobbyists review, debate, and consider hundreds of legislative issues. During the 2019 legislative session 1,589 legislative bills and resolutions were introduced. Although, over 1,500 bills were considered, not all became law.

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs serves as an advocate for veterans and reviews all the bills introduced and identifies those that will impact our veterans.

State legislation that will impact veterans

and their families after July 1 include the following:

- Exemptions from the twelve-month residency requirement for university students was modified to be in compliance with federal regulations. Simply put, this was a cleanup bill and does not change eligibility.
- Property tax exemption was increased from \$100,000 to \$150,000 of the full and true value of a dwelling that is owned and occupied by a veteran who is rated permanently and totally disabled from a service connected disability(ies).
- Annual certification is no longer required for the property tax exemption for certain paraplegic or amputee veterans or their surviving spouses.
- The number of days is unlimited for group pheasant hunts for disabled veterans and purple heart recipients.

Federal benefits are ever changing and can be very confusing. We encourage all veterans to visit their county or tribal veterans service officers (CTVSO's) and allow them to assist in filing claims. These men and women have worn the boots, walked the trenches, conducted maneuvers, commanded troops, sustained missions, and protected our freedoms. Who better to have on your team? USD Students Research Clay County Fallen Veterans

For the fourth year in a row, USD students dug into the history of "Clay County's Fallen" during their SEED 415: 7-12 Social Science Methods course this spring. This year's first place researcher, as determined by a panel of judges from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 3061, was USD student Brett Hughes, who will be a featured speaker at Vermillion's

Memorial Day observation in May.

Hughes received a \$150 cash award from the VFW and the guest speaker honor. The veteran he wrote about was Lloyd Merlin Thompson.

Course instructor Jing Williams created this community-based research project to help the community, as well as to inspire her students about how to teach about war.

"Each student enrolled in this course researches a fallen hero from Clay County, South Dakota, and writes a biography for that fallen hero," said Williams. "This project was designed to enlighten future secondary social studies teachers how to teach about wars from a human perspective, teach them how to do research through local archives and online resources, increase their awareness of veterans' ultimate sacrifice to this country, honor the fallen heroes, and foster a strong and positive relationship between the University of South Dakota and the local community."

USD student Brett Hughes is presented his first place award by Andy Howe, VFW Post 3061 quartermaster. A panel of judges from the VFW Post determined that Hughes is the "first place researcher" among university students researching

Clay County's fallen veterans.

Researching local heroes is not an easy task, admits Williams.

"These were veterans who hadn't been written about previously," she said. "There was scarce public information about these fallen heroes. My students had to do real historical research. They worked like historians, spending hours and hours in the libraries and archives looking for pieces of information about their fallen heroes. They visited the Clay County Historical Society, where the Executive Director Wess Pravecek worked with them and guided them how to find more information on their subject. One student also found a good amount of information of his fallen veteran at the W. H. Over Museum. Most family members or relatives of the fallen had passed away or were impossible to be contacted. However, several student researchers were lucky enough to find their fallen's family members or relatives and were able to conduct personal interviews as well."

Williams hopes the research conducted by her students will have a lasting impact on the Vermillion community. Last fall, Williams compiled previous student work into a book, "Hometown's Fallen: Discovering the Human Aspects of Wars," which features the stories of 10 fallen veterans. She is currently working on a second volume to contain 10 more stories. Volume II is scheduled to be published this summer.

"It is our hope that our fallen service members' stories can be remembered forever," said Williams.

SCOTUS Rules on Bladensburg Peace Cross

'The Supreme Court made the right call'

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (June 20, 2019) - Today, the U.S. Supreme Court announced its decision that the World War I memorial in the shape of a 40-foot-tall cross can continue to stand on public land in Maryland. The high court's 7-2 decision in favor of allowing the cross to stand, clarifies the fact that the mere shape of a monument does not create an "Establishment" of religion. Therefore, the nearly 100-year-old memorial will be allowed to stay on public land. The Veterans of Foreign Wars' amicus brief is cited in the opinion.

"The Supreme Court made the right call," said VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence. "Today's decision not only protects this memorial outright, but helps to establish a precedent to protect thousands of other veterans' memorials that currently reside on federal, state or

Blue Water Navy Act Now Law

VFW-championed Legislation will benefit tens of thousands of veterans and dependent children

WASHINGTON - The national commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is saluting the president for signing the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019 into law.

"Tens of thousands of Blue Water Navy veterans of the Vietnam War and dependent children born with spina bifida due to a parent's toxic exposure will now benefit from this new law," exclaimed VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence, "and the VFW is proud to have helped lead the charge to return these benefits to these deserving veterans and to expand existing benefits to dependent children. We look forward to the Department of Veterans Affairs publishing implementation guidance on their website very soon."

The VFW-championed Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019, or H.R. 299, restores VA benefits to thousands of Blue Water Navy Vietnam veterans who had their disability eligibility taken away in 2002 after arbitrary regulatory changes. It benefits veterans exposed to Agent Orange while serving along the Korean DMZ with an earlier start date to encompass the timeframe when various defoliants were tested — to Sept. 1, 1967, instead of April 1, 1968 — and expands benefits to children born with spina bifida due to a parent's exposure in Thailand, coverage that already exists for the children of Vietnam and Korean DMZ veterans. The new law also requires the VA to report on research being conducted on a broad range of conditions possibly related to service in Southwest Asia, which is important for future legislative efforts to create a list of presumptive conditions for veterans seeking VA health care and benefits.

"The VFW is proud of the 116th Congress for ending this benefits inequity, and we salute President Trump for quickly signing H.R. 299 into law," said Lawrence.

Though the following VA webpages have yet to updated to reflect the new law, veterans and their families can learn more about benefits associated with Agent Orange exposure here, and about spina bifida birth defects related to exposure here. For assistance in filing claims, find an accredited VFW service officer here.

South Dakota State Cemetery Update

Ownership of land donated by the City of Sioux Falls has been transferred to the State of outh Dakota. The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs has been working closely with numerous state agencies, our design firm Stockwell Engineers and the National Cemetery Administration, on the schematic design of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery (SDVC).

Journey Construction has been selected as the Construction Manager at Risk for the project. Journey will work with the Department to make the best use of the grant dollars received from the project and ensure that the project is completed on budget and in a timely manner.

The SDVC is on schedule. Currently, the SDVC is in the sixty-five percent design phase. Ground could be broken on the project in late 2019. It is estimated that the SDVC will take twelve to eighteen months to complete once construction begins.


Department of SD Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Announces 2nd Annual Youth Baseball Grant Results

Sioux Falls (May 31, 2019) – Department of SD VFW Baseball Chairman, Danny Frisby-Griffin, released the results of the Program's 2nd Annual Youth Baseball Grant Program. Drawing upon set-aside funds and a generous donation from the Frisby- Griffin Family, VFW Baseball was able to provide a total of \$1500 divided among the following two grant applications: Scotland Athletic Association and Salem Baseball.

The grant program was created to help ensure youth across South Dakota have an opportunity to participate in baseball. In addition to the grant program, the Department of SD VFW Baseball also created a Youth Baseball Community of the Year Award (monetary), Friends of VFW Baseball and established a Veterans Program Donation process to allow VFW Baseball to donate to various VFW Veterans programs and initiatives.

Scotland Athletic Association plan on utilizing their funding to remodel their batting cage by putting down artificial turf as well as getting a new net. The batting cage is used by all teams in town. Salem Baseball are also utilizing their grant for Field Turf installation on baselines, base paths and walk up paths on the baseball field. This ambitious project is estimated at \$55,000.

This is an awesome opportunity for the Department of SD VFW and their Baseball program to give back to the future leaders of our nation," said Frisby-Griffin. "And who knows, there may be a future major league player out there that just needed a bit of support to keep playing."

Sioux Falls VA Campus and Facilities Will Become Smoke Free


