3. Legislative Conference for VFW is 25-26 January in Pierre, SD. We will be awarding the Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen winners as well as recognizing the Teachers of the Year. Dale and Margaret Greenfield will be announcing our State winners at the convention. We will have training on the dashboard as well as a benefits briefing by the Dept VSO. We will also discuss all 47 Posts. On Saturday night, the VFW will join the VFW Auxiliary in a contest providing soup for our evening meal. We need VFW members to volunteer to bring soup. Please, also, bring your non-perishable items for the SD VFW and SD VFW Auxiliary for our joint fundraiser. You should also contact your local legislators and plan to meet with them on Monday morning and/or invite them to the legislative mixer on Monday night.
