General Orders #5 "The Future is Now"

November 1, 2017

Happy Thanksciving

The Department Commander and his staff extend Thanksgiving greetings to all comrades and sisters and their families. On this special day let us give thanks for the privilege of living in the United States.

1. Audit Reports: Another quarter has closed. Posts are reminded that your Post Audit Reports are now due. If you are delinquent in any other quarters, please catch up to date.

2. **Community Service Reports:** Our Department Community Service Chairman is in need of Community Service Reports. A few Posts have submitted their reports, however a majority of the Posts have not submitted a report. Deadline for the Department Chairman to forward the report information to National is in December, so send your Community Service Reports to Sean Johnson 1005 N Main, Aberdeen, SD 57402, as soon as possible.

3. Education Teacher Award: The deadline for nomination was November 1, 2017. Post judging should be completed by November 15. Winning entries at the Post level are to be submitted to the Department Chairman, prior to December 15. Each Post is encouraged to have a winner in each of the three categories, K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Post winners should be forwarded to the State Chairperson, Keith Blume, P. O. Box 215, Custer, SD 57730. Prizes have been set as follows: Each teacher category will receive a check of \$100. Award presentation will be determined at a later date. A certificate from National will be presented to the school and teacher at the school with a Department representative presenting the award if possible.

4. **Voice of Democracy:** The deadline for Student entries to be submitted to the Posts was by November 1. Post judging should be completed by November 15. District judging should be completed by December 1, 2017. As soon as possible after District judging is completed, the winning entries and tapes are sent to the State Chairperson, Keith Blume, PO Box 215, Custer SD, 57730. **Prizes have been set as follows:** 1st Place - \$500, a March trip to Washington, DC, a June trip to the Freedom's Foundation and at least a \$1,000 or more scholarship from the National contest. 2nd Place - \$300 Suzie Radigan Memorial scholarship, 3rd Place - \$250 cash, and 4th through 7th Place will receive \$50 cash prize. Each District will send their district winner to Pierre for the presentations of the State winners during the Legislative Conference. Trophies and plaques will be presented to the top three winners at the State level.

5. **Patriots Pen:** The deadline for Student entries to be submitted to the Posts was by November 1. Post judging should be completed by November 15. District judging should be completed by December 1, 2017. As soon as possible after District judging is completed, send the winning entries to the State Chairperson, Keith Blume, PO Box 215, Custer SD, 57730. **Prizes have been set as follows:** 1^{st} Place – the Glenn McFarland Memorial Plaque and \$250 cash; 2^{nd} Place – Daryl and Loretta Halling Memorial Plaque and a \$100 cash, 3^{rd} Place – \$50 cash and 4^{th} through 7^{th} Places - \$25 cash. The top 2 winners in the State will be presented their awards at the Legislative Conference. Plaques will be presented to the top two winners at the State Level.

6. Veterans in the Classroom: November is VFW "Veterans In The Classroom Month". VFW and its Auxiliary members are encouraged to volunteer to be presenters in the classroom.

7. Veterans Day and Reports: Posts are urged to start planning a suitable program now for the observance of Veterans Day, November 11. Post Commanders, immediately after Veterans Day, submit a report to the Veterans Day Chairman, Danny Frisby-Griffin, 418 NE Fifth St., Madison, SD 57042. Form can be found on the Web SDVFW.org.

8. Legislative Conference: Department Legislative Conference has been set for January 28th and 29th 2017 in Pierre.

9. **Relief Fund:** Section 704, of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, states that a Post or Auxiliary can donate to the National Military Service Program by use of the Relief Fund. These programs were a tremendous success in 2016-2017, thanks to all of you that helped. As our men and women serve and sacrifice, let's ensure they receive the necessary help they need, particularly during the upcoming holiday season. Section 704 further outlines other various things for which the Post Relief Fund can be used for: A few years ago, the phrase, "To foster true patriotism through historical and educational programs" was added to this section. This phrase allows the Post to use the Relief Funds for the Voice of Democracy Program or other Americanism programs that are educational. The Relief Fund may not be used for Post building projects, hall remodeling, color guard uniforms or any other expenditure that does not follow the guidelines in Section 704.

10. **Sending In Material For General Orders:** All Department Officers, State Chairman and anyone else that wants to publish information in the General Orders must submit the material to Department Headquarters by no later than the 25th day of the month preceding the publication of the General Orders.

11. **Solicitation of Funds:** A Post or District soliciting funds outside the geographical area of their community must obtain the permission of the Post or District Commander involved. Any requests for soliciting of funds from outside the Department of South Dakota should be disregarded, unless it has been cleared by a memorandum from Department Headquarters. Any such letters or circulars asking for funds should be sent to Department Headquarters.

12. **Inspection of Post Books:** All Post Commanders and Post Quartermasters are reminded that all Post books are subject to inspection According to Section 218, (5) h of the National Manual of Procedures. Department Officers requesting inspections of the books are to be allowed to examine books at a reasonable time at the Post Home.

13. **Dues:** The second membership dues reminder notice for 2018 was mailed to unpaid members in October. Post Officers should conduct a membership campaign to follow up on dues notices.

14. **Dues Reserve Fund:** Reference Section 717, Manual of Procedure and By Laws: A dues reserve fund shall be credited within each Department and Post with not less than fifty percent of its part of the current years' dues paid by each member prior to July 1, including Life Membership dues payouts received from the National Organization. The Quartermaster shall not disburse nor shall an obligation be incurred against this fund until after July 1, at which time it shall be transferred to the general fund and be available for expenditures.

Fall if my favorite time of the year with the changing the colors of the leaves and fresh crisp air. By now many of us should be receiving some of the write-ups for the programs; Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, Teacher of the Year, EMS, Police, Firefighters of the Year, Americanism and School Projects. Please get them in by the due dates. We also get to look forward to Veterans Day on November 11th, 2017! And everyone should continue to focus on Membership!

You don't do it simply for fun — you do it because you believe in our military and know that, if it weren't for the men and women who serve, we would not enjoy the freedom we have today.

Veterans Day is a time for us to pay our respects to those who have served. For one glorious day, you are joined by everyone else around the nation who doesn't spend every waking moment breathing this military stuff like you do. For one day, we stand united in respect for our veterans.

This holiday started as a day to reflect upon the heroism of those who died in our country's service, and was originally called Armistice Day. It fell on Nov. 11 because that is the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. However, in 1954, the holiday was changed to "Veterans Day" in order to account for all veterans in all wars.

Even we veterans who have done our part see young and old service members and veterans — our grandchildren, sons, daughters, wives, husbands and grandparents — and we can't begin to fathom what they've been through in the name of our freedom. The depth of experiences is vast, and the appreciation we have for them on all days, but especially this day, is deep.

Today, we take the charge of Veterans Day to heart and mark the day with celebration, honoring America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

A possible lifesaver.

This comes from Dr. Patrick Teefy, Cardiology Head at the Nuclear Medicine Institute University Hospital, London Ont.

- 1. Let's say it's 7:25 pm and you're going home after an unusually hard day on the job.
- 2. You're really tired, upset and frustrated.

3. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to drag out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five km from the hospital nearest your home.

4. Unfortunately you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far.

5. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.

- 6. HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE?
- Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness.
 - 7. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously.
- A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest.
- A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again.

8. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it to regain a normal rhythm.

- In this way, heart attack victims can get help or to a hospital.
 - 9. Tell as many other people as possible about this. It could save their lives!

10. A cardiologist says: "If everyone who gets this email & kindly sends it to 10 people, you can bet that we'll save at least one life".

11. Rather than sending jokes, please contribute by forwarding this email which can save a person's life....

12. If this message comes around to you more than once..... please don't get irritated..... U need to be happy that you have many friends who care about you & you are being reminded of how to tackle....

Heart attacks.... when you are alone.
