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# VA Conducts Nation's Largest Analysis of Veteran Suicide

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has undertaken the most comprehensive analysis of Veteran suicide rates in the U.S., examining over 55 million Veteran records from 1979 to 2014 from every state in the nation. The effort extends VA's knowledge from the previous report issued in 2010, which examined three million Veteran records from 20 states were available. Based on the data from 2010, VA estimated the number of Veteran deaths by suicide averaged 22 per day. The current analysis indicates that in 2014, an average of 20 Veterans a day died from suicide.


It has been a very challenging and learning experience to understand what the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Department of South Dakota is all about. "No One Does More For Veterans."

Fortunately for the Home, Brandon's definition of family includes the extended family of VFW members and military families in general. He has strong feelings about their treatment.


**First:** He says it is normal for people to struggle with the aftermath of war and families must be cared for in a manner that doesn't stigmatize them.

## Veterans and Military Support

Unmet Needs under the Veterans and Military Support Program continues to provide financial aid in the form of a grant of up to \$5,000 to service members who run into unexpected financial difficulties as a result of deployment or other military-related activity. Over \$2.5 million in grants have been provided to struggling families since 2004.

All applications are individually reviewed on a caseby-case basis.

All the following eligibility criteria must be met for the grant to be considered:

- The service member has served Active Duty, other than training, within the past six years prior to applying.
- The hardship must be due to one of the following:
   Deployment
  - Military pay issue
  - •Military illness or injury
- The applicant must be the service member or an eligible dependent listed under DEERS.
- Expenses eligible for consideration of payment:
  Household expenses mortgage, rent, repair, insurance.
- Vehicle expenses payments, insurance, repairs (major repairs for vehicles over ten years old will not be considered)
- Utilities
- Food and clothing
- Children's clothing, deapers, formula, school or child-care expenses
- Medical bills, prescriptions & eyeglasses the patient's portion for necessary or emergency medical care only
- Expenses ineligible for consideration for payment:
- Credit cards, military charge cards, or retail store credit cards
- Personal, student or payday loans
- Cable, Internet and secondary phone
- Cosmetic or investigational medical procedures and expenses
- Taxes property or otherwise
- College expenses
- Furniture rentals
- Any other expense not determined to be a basic life need

Payments will be made at the discretion of the approval committee. Payments are made directly creditors.

If this criteria is met, the service member should not have any problem having their grant approved, unless they are living way beyond their means.

## VA Black Hills Health Care System Update

Thank you for the opportunity to share some of the latest information about VA Black Hills Health Care System. On behalf of the hard working and caring employees at VA Black Hills I'm pleased to share the good news of our recent achievement of 5 Stars in Quality on the SAIL report for both Hot Springs and Fort Meade. This was an incredible benchmark to reach and we are committed to sustaining this high level of performance. Our team is involved in a number of important "MyVA" initiatives taking place across our health care system aimed at improving the Veteran's experience. The Veteran Preferential Treatment (VPT) program continues to rollout across our system of care. Under this approach, Veterans are asked to check out at our coordination station to meet with a VPT team member to better understand their next steps in care including scheduling appointments internally or through Choice.

There are still a number of questions and concerns about the Veterans Choice Program. There have been some notable improvements made including a recent change to authorize VA to enter into new provider agreements to allow us to schedule some appointments with community providers under the Choice program. Any Veteran experiencing difficulty with Veterans Choice should contact one of our Choice Champions for assistance by calling 605-347-2511 ext 7632 or 605-745-2000 ext 2253.

Within the past few months, VA Black Hills has filled several key clinical leadership roles. However, we are aggressively recruiting for physicians to address a critical staffing shortage, particularly in the areas of primary care/PACT and in-patient in Hot Springs. Because you are among our best recruiters we are asking everyone to share the noble mission of VA in an effort to get quality providers to join our team.

On June 20, 2016 the public comment period on the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will close. After that time a final EIS will be compiled to be followed by a Record of Decision. This has been a long, but important process for our Veterans and our employees and we are looking forward to a decision on the reconfiguration of our healthcare system.

VA Black Hills is a proud commemorative partner in the 50th Anniversary Vietnam War remembrance. Along with our VA partners, we have been a part of two Welcome Home events. We look forward to additional ceremonies over the next few years to provide the proper welcome home that Vietnam Veterans deserve.

Right now we are in the process of moving into our new surgical suites at the Fort Meade campus. The addition will accommodate the latest technology and improve patient privacy and flow. On July 22nd, we hosted the public for tours and an open house and you're all invited.

**Background:** Politicians, pundits and politicallymotivated organizations are using the national crisis in access to care at the Department of Veterans Affairs as justification to dismantle and privatize the VA health care system, with some even proposing that veterans be charged for their service-connected care. ## Lt. Governor Visits Electric Boat Facility To Discuss Plans For USS South Dakota

PIERRE, S.D. – Lt. Gov. Matt Michels today visited the Connecticut facility where the USS South Dakota SSN 790 will be built. At the facility, Michels toured the recently commissioned USS Illinois and met with the ship commander, the chief of the boat and the ship manager who is overseeing construction of the USS South Dakota.

"The USS South Dakota BB-57 was the most decorated warship of World War II. With the construction of the SSN 790, we're moving the history of the USS South Dakota forward to protect our nation," said. Lt. Gov. Michels.

General Dynamics Electric Boat is building the multi-mission nuclear powered Virginia class submarine which will support a crew of 130 sailors. The company has been building submarines since 1899 when it assembled the U.S. Navy's first commissioned undersea warship, the USS Holland.

Construction for the USS South Dakota will begin in 2016. The submarine is expected to be complete in August of 2018.
