General Orders Number 1 - July 2017

Must be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

 <u>Responsibility:</u> I promise, having been duly elected and installed as President of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary, Department of South Dakota at the convention in Pierre, SD, on June 25, 2017, I hereby assume the duties of this office. I pledge to uphold the principles of this organization and will do my very best to carry out the duties of the office to the best of my ability. Thank you for your confidence.

2. Officers and Chairmen: Being elected and appointed on all levels for the 2017 – 2018 term of office shall assume the duties of their respective office immediately. All 2016-2017 appointments are null and void. Past Officers and Chairmen are requested to give your successor all books, papers and other items pertaining to your office. Please offer them your assistance and guidance.

Thank you for accepting these positions.

Auxiliary Presidents: Get your program chairmen lists to your District President AND
Department Secretary as soon as possible. This allows our department chairmen to immediate
and closer contact with their auxiliary counterparts allowing for better execution of our
programs.

4. <u>Auxiliary Secretary:</u> Please distribute the Program bulletins included with each General Orders to the respective chairmen prior to the meeting that immediately follows that publication so

she/he can study the bulletin and promote the program at your meeting.

5. <u>Auxiliary Treasurers:</u> The new MALTA program is available with video training on the national website. You will find in these general orders, there is an instruction sheet of how to process through the new system. This will be a learning process for us all, but we have some great support with Department Treasurer Carol Gross, Department Assistant Treasurer Pam Vissia and National Recruiter/Trainer Nancy Worth. You will find all contact information for these three officers in the Department Roster included. Additional training will be available at the Annual Retreat and Fall Council.

6. President and Treasurer Bonds for Auxiliaries and Districts: The Bond Applications will be emailed in early July 2017 with a link to purchase these Bonds online. Those without email can find the Bond Applications in the Treasurer's Kit. Be sure to complete the applications and mail them with a check (earmarked Bond) IMMEDIATELY to: Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary National Headquarters, 406 W. 34th Street 10th Floor, Kansas City, MO 64111. Remember

President and Treasurers are required to be bonded per Section 814.

7. <u>Communication:</u> All General Orders from Department President are official and must be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference for one year. (Reference: Booklet of Instruction, page 6.) All other communications from National or Department Officers are also official and should be read at once. All Chairmen bulletins should be read in advance by the Program Chairman and only a report should be given on the Auxiliary floor.

8. <u>Correspondence</u>: 2016 Bylaws, Section 812. All communications of any nature whatsoever intended for the consideration of the National Body shall be signed by the President and forwarded by the Secretary of the Auxiliary to the Department President. All official communications to National Officers from the Auxiliary must also be forwarded through channels. See Booklet of Instruction, as to how correspondence is to be handled.

 Audit: The second quarter Audit is due July 30, 2017. It shall be conducted during the month of July with both the outgoing and incoming Treasurer and Trustees present. Refer to 2017 Bylaws Section 814, Pages 95-96; Trustees, Duties of (All Levels). The President, Secretary and Treasurer should attend the Audit. The Trustees shall submit and read the written report during an Auxiliary meeting. A motion to accept the audit is required. A copy of the accepted audit shall be included in the minutes record book. The Senior Trustee shall send a signed copy of audit immediately to the Department Treasurer who will review it for accuracy and corrections.

10. <u>National Convention:</u> National Convention will be July 22 - 26, 2017, in New Orleans, LA. The 2017-2018 National Program Book is now available on the National Auxiliary website

(vfwauxiliary.org). We are looking forward to having a good group at National.

11. <u>Department, District and Auxiliary Rosters:</u> The roster is included in this General Orders. Please review for accuracy and notify Department Secretary, Jennifer Little, with corrections. 

Changes to the system for everything —— National has switched companies, and this requires new methods of reporting for all activities. There will be training sessions done for all Treasurers, Secretaries, and Presidents. Dates to be determined.

MALTA system of remitting dues for members: This is a whole new system set up by National Headquarters. Membership dues may now be paid directly to National by any member, any auxiliary treasurer, or by the Department Treasurer. To learn this new system, please attend training sessions so that there will be less chance of making mistakes and resulting in members not being listed as paid. Please note that you will have the option of sending in your dues directly to the Department Treasurer as you have always done. Just PLEASE make sure you are using the correct forms for new members, transferring members, and Convert-to-Life members which are also included in this mailing.

There will be a whole different sign-in page, and there is a system in place for opening up the program. This will be taught to you during training session.

Also, there is a place in this new system for purchasing your Bond, and this will also be taught to you during the training sessions. Also available is the ability to make your annual \$2.00 donation to Cancer Aid & Research or other National programs using this program.

IMPORTANT REMINDER:

You will NOT receive a Treasurer's Kit this year!

Due to the transition to our new membership system, MALTA, we will not be sending Treasurer's Kits this year. The 2017-2018 Treasurer Resources page can be accessed here:

https://vfwauxiliary.org/treasurer-resources/

Q: How will members get their membership cards?

A: Once National Headquarters receives annual dues for a member, MALTA will create a list of those who need annual cards. That list will go to a printer where all the cards will be printed and mailed.

O: How long will they have to wait to get their card?

A: Once payment has cleared at National Headquarters and the member's information is sent, printed and mailed, we expect a time frame of 2-4 weeks.

Q: What will a member show at meetings to prove they are a member?

A: You must provide an official receipt for their payment. If they pay their dues online through MALTA, they can access a digital version of their membership card right away and can show this as proof of eligibility for any official VFW Auxiliary function. A receipt template can be found on the 2017-2018 Treasurer Resources page.

Q: Do I HAVE to use MALTA?

A: We highly encourage you to use this wonderful new tool that was designed with YOU in mind. However, we do recognize that not everyone has the technology or desire to use new software. You can use the old forms and old methods of processing dues.

Q: Where do I get all these forms?

A: You can get those forms on the Treasurer Resources page where you downloaded them from last year. All of the documents have been updated for the 2017-2018 year.

O: Will we get a new Treasurer's Guide?

A: Yes! The 2017-2018 Treasurer's Guide is available on the Treasurer Resources page. Remember, you can still process dues EXACTLY how you've always done it before. OR, you can choose to process them online through MALTA or teach your members how to do it themselves online.

O: How will I know how to use MALTA?

A: Your Department Treasurer, or Department representative, was trained in May. That person will teach others in your Department how to use it. There are also training videos on the Online Auxiliary Academy and there will be training videos and instructions within MALTA on how to use it.

Q: Who do I call if I have questions about using MALTA?

A: We are pleased to tell you that there is a helpline just for MALTA users: 1-800-349-3670. Calls will be answered beginning July 7, Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Central Time.

Q: What about Life Members? Will they get new cards?

A: Yes! All Life Members in our system as of April 26, 2017, will receive a brand new Life Membership Card compatible with MALTA. Life Memberships purchased between April 27 and June 30 will receive their cards in late July.

Because of this, any current Life Members who transfer Auxiliaries between May 1 and June 30, 2017, will not receive a new Life Membership card issued from National Headquarters. In the first part of July 2017, these members will receive a new card with their <u>old</u> Auxiliary information. National Headquarters will then submit data to our fulfillment firm in early July for Life Members who transferred between May 1 and June 30, 2017. It is our expectation that these Life Members will receive a new card with their <u>new</u> Auxiliary information on it near the end of July that will contain their correct Auxiliary information.

VFW Auxiliary, Department of South Dakota Council of Administration Minutes June 25, 2017 - Pierre, South Dakota

The Council of Administration meeting came to order at 11:32AM at the Convention Center at the Ramada Inn in Pierre, SD on June 25, 2017 with Carrie Alm, Department President, presiding.

The minutes of the previous Council of Administration meeting were dispensed as the meeting was during this convention and previous secretary, Nancy Chester, has not had time to get them together. It was stated they would be published in the General Orders for review.

Attendance was called with all officers in attendance per the attendance register.

Opening prayer was read by Chaplain Donita Mullinix. The pledge of allegiance was recited and the Star-Spangled Banner was sung.

Communications were read from SD Veteran Cemetery Committee updating us on their progress this year and requesting dues and names of our representatives.

President Alm introduced visitors to our meeting of Immediate Past Department President Karen Sharp, newly installed District 6 President Nancy Chester and Department Guard Patricia Mitchell. She also gave an introduction of all her 2017-2018 officers.

The financial report was requested from the Department Treasurer Carol Gross, she advised there was no change since it was read during convention.

The proposed budget was read for the 2017-2018 year by Budget Chairman Nancy Chester. It was moved by District 6 President Nancy Chester and 2nd by Jr. Vice President Sandy Moss to accept the budget. Department President Alm informed them of correcting a header on their form to state "Hospital" and brought up that the part of the budget about the Legislative Auction was a district fundraiser and we cannot require them to give us the amount we have listed on the budget. Nancy Chester explained that the amounts we needed to cover our budget was not able to be balanced without adding that in to make it work. Karen Sharp, Past Department President, advised that we would need a change in the standing rules to make the budget and rules match so that we could go forward with the change. District 10 President Nancy Worth advised that suggested that instead of changing the Standing Rules, we just do a live auction at Legislative for our part and bringing in some of the fun that State Commander Rick Williamson had talked about at installation. Department Treasurer Carol Gross advised that she can only pay and reimburse from what is in the budget. If it's in the standing rules and not in the budget, she advised that she could not compensate for that item per National's instruction. Past Department President Sharp spoke again and offered some clarification that if the budget was approved is the only reason we would need to change the standing rules. PDP and Chief of Staff Vickie Rosse offered information as to how the process and correction would work. Department Jr. Vice Moss offered information about the positive response and funds of silent auctions and how not many items would be needed. President Alm asked for a vote at this time, there was a majority vote for accepting the proposed budget, motion was carried.

The audit report was requested and Sr. Vice President Mary Kirkvold advised the available audit was given during convention with no change yet.

Unfinished Business

Department President Alm added some introductions that she forgot. Vickie Rosse is our Big 10 Hospital Chairman and Pat Cerny is our Big 10 Legislative Chairman.

Chief of Staff Vickie Rosse presented President Carrie Alm with the District 2 original 1949 and current Charter.

District 6 President Chester and Past District 8 member presented President Alm with the District 8 Charter.

It was brought to the floor that some of the awards are not properly specified such as not doing a winner for each category, just an overall winner and so on, and this needed to be corrected. These are past department president awards, not something the floor needed to fix. Chief of Staff Rosse and Past Department President Club representative said they were aware of this and were getting things corrected. President Alm and Department Secretary Jennifer Little said they would get a copy of the proper awards out in general orders once they were corrected. President Alm wanted to thank everyone for their support and confidence in her for the upcoming year and thinks that all working together we will have a great year.

New Business

It was moved by District 10 President Worth and 2nd by Jr. Vice President Sandy Moss to add a spot on standing rules in Section 5 and adding Item C to do fundraisers to increase budget as a Department, there was no discussion, vote was unanimous, motion was carried. It was moved by Chief of Staff Rosse and 2nd by District 10 President Worth that we have delegates for Big 10 of Department President Carrie Alm, Sr. Vice President Mary Kirkvold, Chief of Staff and Big 10 Hospital Chairman Vickie Rosse, Jr. Vice President Sandy Moss and Big 10 Legislative Chairman Pat Cerny, vote was unanimous, motion was carried. It was moved by Jr. Vice President Sandy Moss and 2nd by Department Guard Patti Mitchell to make our alternates for Big 10 Conference Department Conductress Wanda Mix. Department

make our alternates for Big 10 Conference Department Conductress Wanda Mix, Department Chaplain Donita Mullinix, PDP Jan Endes, PDP Karen Sharp and PDP Nelda Jorgensen, vote was unanimous, motion was carried.

Gloria Fortin addressed the floor about the District President who did not get her Susie Radigan award plaque at the banquet the night before because it was not ordered. It seems the committees were not completely aware of their duties in their entirety and it was requested that we get better information to them so that nothing gets overlooked.

Nelda Jorgensen addressed the floor stating that she didn't receive her Gold Star Mother invitation until long after the registration was turned. She felt this was a waste of money and the invites need to go out earlier or just forget sending them.

Announcements

We need General Order Bulletins ASAP.

Please get your VAVS rep or deputy forms filled out.

Let Department Secretary Little know if you need the 2017-2018 Officers book or program book. President Alm reminded us to Support our Officers, no backbiting or petty stuff among our sisters and brothers.

Department Guard Mitchell advised of her Buddy Poppy Quilt, she wanted districts to take pictures and take back to your district. Vets and Family Support chairman in your auxiliary have the opportunity to win that blanket depending on a points system that they will be turning in monthly. Patti will be sending those criteria out very soon. The chairman with the most points will win the quilt at next convention.

The meeting was closed in regular form at 12:45PM. The next meeting will be on October 7,

2017 at Cedar Shores Convention Center in Oacoma, SD.

I would like to thank President Carrie for appointing me as this year's Scholarships Chairman. Each of our scholarships encourages patriotism, and assists students in attaining an education. We have four scholarships: Continuing Education, Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest, Voice of Democracy (VOD), and Patriot's Pen Essay (PP).

Continuing Education Scholarship is open to any Auxiliary member (who has belonged for at least one year), spouse, son or daughter with a financial need and at least 18 years old. Entrant must complete the application and submit an essay of 300 words or less. \$1,000 will be awarded to the winning applicant. Deadline is February 15, 2018

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest is open to all students, including home-schooled students, in grades 9-12. No digital art will be accepted, and artwork must be on canvas or paper. Students must attend school in the state of the sponsoring Auxiliary. Deadline is March 31, 2018.

Voice of Democracy Audio-Essay Contest is open to all students, including home-schooled students in grades 9-12. This year's theme is: **OUR HOPE FOR THE FUTURE**. The deadline is October 31, 2017. Our Dept. winner will receive an all-expense paid trip to Washington, DC.

The Patriot's Pen Essay Contest is open to all students, including home-schooled students, in grandees 6-8. Student must be a resident of the state where entered. The theme for PP is: **AMERICA'S GIFT TO MY GENERATION** and the deadline is October 31, 2017.

The Dandelion – The Flower of the Military Child

It's a survivor in a broad range of climates. Military children bloom everywhere the winds carry them. They are hardy and upright. Their roots are strong, cultivated deeply in the culture of the military, planted swiftly and surely. They're ready to fly in the breezes that take them to new adventures, new lands, and new friends. Experts say that military children are well-rounded, culturally aware, tolerant, and extremely resilient. Military children have learned from an early age that home is where their hearts are, that a good friend can be found in every corner of the world, and that education doesn't only come from school. They live history. They learn that to survive means to adapt, that the door that closes one chapter of their life opens up to a new and exciting adventure full of new friends and new experiences.

Veterans & Family Support is truly the "heart and soul" of who we are as an organization and what we do. As family members of veterans, the Ladies Auxiliary VFW is first and foremost a veterans' service organization founded on the principle of helping veterans. So, what better way to continue assisting our veterans and their families than through the Veterans & Family Support program? This program, more than any other, is our opportunity to thank those who served or who are serving and to ensure that every veteran and every veteran's family is never forgotten and is always taken well care of. One program that encompasses so much. Overwhelming? Absolutely not. Quite the contrary. At its most simplistic definition is comes down to — "What have you done for a veteran or his/her family today?" Pretty simple. Wouldn't you agree? It is a program with endless possibilities.

Our troops and their families need support now more than ever remember, to keep your Adopt-A-Unit active, must receive an annual Adopt-A-Unit activity report. Units in need of your help I have names of unit's that need your help or to adopt a unit.

Why should you Adopt-a-Unit? To support your local military members & families - To help connect military members with the network of resources the VFW has available - To help you recruit new members

<u>Every day the VFW and VFW Auxiliary are supporting our troops around the</u>
<u>world.</u> Our members offer support in so many ways: Sending care packages to deployed troops - Hosting send-off and welcome-home events - Assisting military families get through long deployments -And the list goes on and on.

<u>Buddy Poppy:</u> Here are some important things to consider when preparing for your Buddy Poppy distribution: Identify potential volunteers within your Post and Auxiliary and gather them together for an informational meeting explaining the purpose of the Buddy Poppy campaign. <u>Choose high traffic areas</u> and determine the number of workers you need to cover the locations. Ideal locations include storefronts, office or factory entrances and recreational areas. Make sure you get permission from the business owners before setting up shop. Post

flyers around town in key areas such as the Post Office, coffee shops, gas stations, etc. It will let people know when and where they can get a Buddy Poppy. Remind your_volunteers that they are not "selling" Buddy Poppies, but distributing them with the hope of getting donations.

How can members best support the VFW Post with this program? Remember that our communities can be involved in almost every aspect of our VFW and Auxiliary Program. Promote Buddy Poppies Assist with National Veterans Service and National Military Services Participate in Hospital volunteerism Participate in and receive VFW programs. Ask your local groups to help: ROTC and Sea Cadet groups can post colors, Scouting groups can conduct flag awareness programs, young people can assist veterans with Buddy Poppy drives and promotions, they can assist with patriotic holiday activities such as placing flags on gravesites or singing to or reading to veterans in nursing homes or hospitals. We have available to us an endless resource of energy and activity. We have only to ask the youth of our community to get involved and we will reap the benefits.

Greetings Auxiliary Members and welcome to a new and exciting Auxiliary year! I am very excited and honored to be your Department Youth Activities Chairman. Thank you, President Carrie for placing your trust in me.

The VFW Auxiliary strives to help teach our nation's youth the skills to become responsible adults through serving our country, communities, veterans and active-duty military. We have a new generation of veterans who need the support of family, friends and country as they serve overseas and when they come home from conflicts abroad. Engaging youth in positive volunteer experiences are one of the ways we can offer support to our veterans.

There are a number of youth programs that your auxiliary can sponsor and/or request their assistance in your many activities:

- Youth sports teams (any of your school's teams—including your VFW Teener Baseball)
- Church youth groups
- · After-school programs
- Youth-focused organizations (ie: Boys Clubs and Girls Clubs)
- School clubs (ie: FHA-FCCLA-Honors Society)
- · Home-school associations
- Youth community service groups (ie: Boy Scouts—Girl Scouts—4-H Clubs)
- · Nonprofit organization youth advisory councils
- Service learning and civic departments in high schools and colleges

The Auxiliary offers a special recognition for our youth. It's called **Random Acts of Patriotism** (**R.A.P.**) We encourage and reward patriotism through R.A.P. If a child is seen thanking a veteran, properly placing their hand on their heart during the Pledge of Allegiance or involved in some other activity that promotes patriotism, we suggest giving them a R.A.P. card and/or coin. It's a fun and unique way to engage children elementary age and younger! The coins can be purchased through the VFW Store and the cards can be printed from the VFW Auxiliary website.

Youth groups can be recognized for their efforts and service projects honoring our veterans and assisting active-duty military and their families. 10 Tips for Working with Youth

When working with youth, it is important to consider their safety and needs. We would like to offer these tips and resources so that you can make sure that all youth you encounter have the best experience possible.

- Consider taking Youth Protection training. Many organizations working with youth provide and require training. One of the best known is done by Boy Scouts. You do not need to be a member or even involved with the program in order to take their free online training. Find it here: http://www.scouting.org/Training/youthproctection.aspx
- Always respect the time commitments of youth. They are very busy. Be clear about when an event or project starts and how long it will go for. Parents also very much appreciate it when their child is finished at the stated time.
- 3. Parents should always be welcome to stay and take part in the activity.
- 4. No matter the project or event, make sure that proper safety measures are taken for everyone involved. Also, be sure that activities or projects are age appropriate.
- 5. Be extremely conscious of the location where you bring or meet the youths.
- 6. Do not smoke, drink or use drugs around them.
- If you are taking youth somewhere other than the Post home or a school, consider getting
 permission slips from every parent, and make sure the parents understand that the children
 may be riding in personal vehicles.
- Receive training from your local Child Abuse Prevention Council or Child Protective Center on the Mandated Suspected Child Abuse Reporting Laws in your state for those working with children.
- 9. Find out if you need to have individuals working with youth/children fingerprinted before working with youth. There may be laws in your state.
- 10. Maintain and model healthy boundaries with children be a role model. Remember it is never appropriate to display acts of violence or abuse around or towards children.

Remember that is only takes a minute to make a difference in the life of a child. There are lots of small, positive things we can all do to help protect and nurture our children that only take a minute. A few words of praise and encouragement to a child, listening carefully to what a child has to say, showing a child you care, all are simple actions that added together have been shown to have a profound impact on a child's life. In these very real ways, we can all support children and strengthen families.
